Qur'an 2:3

Those who believe in the unseen, and establish the prayer, and spend out of what We have provided for them.

Qur'an 2:43

And establish the prayer, and give the zakāh, and bow down with those who bow down.

02

Qur'an 4:102

And when you are among them and lead them in prayer, let a group of them stand with you, and let them carry their arms.

03

Qur'an 9:18

The mosques of Allah are only maintained by those who believe in Allah and the Last Day, establish the prayer, give the zakāh, and fear none but Allah.

04

Qur'an 17:78

Establish the prayer at the decline of the sun until the darkness of night, and the recitation of dawn — indeed, the recitation of dawn is witnessed.

05

Muslim 671

The most beloved of places to Allah are its mosques, and the most detestable of places to Allah are its markets.

06

Bukhārī 651

The people who receive the greatest reward for prayer are those who walk the farthest to it, and then those next farthest.

07

Bukhārī 649

Prayer in congregation is superior to the prayer of a man alone by twenty-seven degrees.

08

Tirmidhī 221

Whoever prays 'Ishā' in congregation, it is as if he prayed half the night.

09

Tirmidhī 221

...and whoever prays the dawn prayer in congregation, it is as if he prayed the entire night.

10

Ibn Mājah 3945

Whoever prays the dawn prayer is under the protection (dhimmah) of Allah.

11

Bukhārī 572

The servant remains in a state of prayer as long as he sits in his place of prayer waiting for the prayer.

12

Bukhārī 660

Seven whom Allah will shade in His shade... among them a man whose heart is attached to the mosques.

13

Bayhaqī 2689

The mosque is the home of every God-fearing person, and Allah has guaranteed comfort and mercy to whoever takes the mosque as his home.

14

Bayhaqī 2689

And Allah guarantees to the one who takes the mosque as his home safe passage over the Bridge (Ṣirāt) to Allah's pleasure and Paradise.

15

Tirmidhī 223

Give glad tidings to those who walk to the mosques in the darkness of the perfect light on the Day of Resurrection.

16

Tirmidhī 224

The best of the men's rows is the first, and the worst of them is the last.

17

Tirmidhī 224

Whoever purifies himself in his house then walks to one of the houses of Allah.

18

Bukhārī 662

Whoever goes to the mosque in the morning or evening, Allah prepares for him an honoured place (nuzul) in Paradise each time he goes in the morning or.

19

Bukhārī 652

If people knew the reward in the call to prayer and the first row... and found no way but to draw lots for it, they would draw lots.

20

Bukhārī 694

They lead you in prayer; if they are correct, you and they are rewarded, and if they err, you are rewarded and the error is upon them.

21

Bukhārī 477

The angels send blessings upon one of you as long as he remains in his place of prayer, so long as he does not break his wuḍū': 'O Allah.

22

Tirmidhī 413

The first of a person's deeds to be judged on the Day of Resurrection is his prayer. If it is sound he has succeeded.

Bukhārī 528	If there were a river at your door in which you bathed five times a day.	24
Muslim 85a	'Which deed is most beloved to Allah?' He ﷺ said: 'The prayer at its proper time.'	25
Muslim 85b	The deed that brings a person nearest to Paradise is the prayer performed at its proper time.	26
Bukhārī 574	Whoever prays the two cool prayers (Fajr and 'Aṣr) will enter Paradise.	27
Ṭabarānī 13/8	Whoever prays the five prayers and avoids the major sins will enter Paradise from whichever gate he wishes.	28
Muslim 725a	The two rak'ahs before the dawn prayer are better than the world and all it contains.	29
Tirmidhī 496	Whoever bathes on Friday and comes early... for every step he takes he has the reward of a year of fasting and standing in prayer.	30
Muslim 16c	Islam is built upon five: the testimony that none is worthy of worship but Allah and that Muhammad is His Messenger, establishing the prayer.	31
Muslim 651b	If they knew what reward lies in the 'Ishā' and dawn prayers, they would come to them even if they had to crawl.	32
Muslim 654a	A man would be brought, supported between two men, until he was made to stand in the row.	33
Muslim 653	'Do you hear the call to prayer?' He said, 'Yes.' He ﷺ said, 'Then answer it.'	34
Bukhārī 1117	Pray standing; if you cannot, then sitting; and if you cannot, then on your side.	35
Muslim 82a	Between a man and shirk and kufr stands the abandonment of prayer.	36
Ibn Mājah 1079	The covenant between us and them is the prayer; whoever abandons it has disbelieved.	37
Muslim 654a	I have seen a time when no one stayed back from it (congregation) except a hypocrite whose hypocrisy was well known.	38
Muslim 651	The heaviest prayers upon the hypocrites are the 'Ishā' and the dawn prayers.	39
Abū Dāwūd 547	There are no three in a town or desert among whom the prayer is not established in congregation but that Satan has overcome them. So hold to the congr.	40
Muslim 654	If you were to pray in your houses as this one who stays behind prays in his house, you would abandon the Sunnah of your Prophet.	41
Bukhārī 644	I had considered ordering the prayer to be established... then going to the men who do not attend the prayer and burning their houses down upon them.	42
Tirmidhī 586	Whoever prays Fajr in congregation, then sits remembering Allah until the sun rises, then prays two rak'ahs, has the reward of a Hajj and 'Umrah.	43
Tirmidhī 3093	When you see a man frequenting the mosques, bear witness to his faith.	44
Tirmidhī 3093	When you see a man habitually frequenting the mosques, bear witness to his faith.	45
